Gov. Weld and both houses of the Massachusetts Legislature called for a statewide campaign to fill the vacant seats in the Silver Haired Legislature, with a proclamation encouraging new candidates. Vacancies for seats in the Silver Haired Legislature exist in Cambridge and Somerville, with Silver Haired legislators to be elected from the same districts as members of the general state Senate and House to comprise a body of 40 senators and 160 representatives statewide.

In the interest of rapidly filling vacancies, election procedures are simplified and may only involve basic interview discussions and collection of community signatures. Silver Haired legislators are all over the age of 60, must be registered voters, and residents of the district they represent.
