IN CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Paul A. Freund on February 5, 1992; and

WHEREAS: Professor Freund was an outstanding teacher, to both students and colleagues, and the dominant figure of his time in the field of constitutional law; and

WHEREAS: Paul Freund was born in St. Louis, graduated from Washington University in 1928 and Harvard Law School in 1931. While at the Law School he was president of the editorial board of the *Harvard Law Review*. He served as a law clerk to Justice Louis D. Brandeis from 1932-33. He worked for the Treasury Department, the Reconstruction Finance Corporation, and the solicitor general's office before joining the Harvard Law School Faculty as a lecturer in 1939. He became professor in 1940, Charles Stebbins Fairchild Professor of Law in 1950, Royall Professor of Law in 1957, and Carl M. Loeb University Professor in 1958, and professor emeritus in 1976; and

WHEREAS: Professor Freund was the author, editor, and co-editor of several books on constitutional law, was a former president of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, chairman from 1970 to 1972 of the Federal Judicial Center's study group on the Supreme Court caseload, chairman of the Judicial Selection Commission for the US Court of Appeals for the First Circuit from 1977 to 79, a former vice president of the Massachusetts Historical Society, and senior fellow of the Harvard Society of Fellows; and

WHEREAS: Professor Freund's many awards included the Research Award of the American Bar Foundation in 1973, the Torch of Learning Award of the American Friends of Hebrew University in 1974 and the Roger Baldwin Award of the Civil Liberties Union of Massachusetts in 1972; and

WHEREAS: Professor Freund is survived by many friends;

WHEREAS: While his work will continue to be a source of inspiration to legal scholars, Paul will sorely be missed by all he touched and loved and taught; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the friends and colleagues of Paul A. Freund at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution on behalf of the entire City Council.

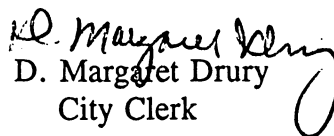
