Mary J. Budina, retired president of Sky Ads in Beverly, died Thursday at her home in Burlington after a four-year battle with cancer. She was 66.

Mrs. Budina was born and raised in Medford and graduated from Medford High School.

At the age of 16, she started work in the garment industry. She worked at Raymond's Department Stores, L. F. E. Electronics, Foxboro Inc., and S & C Contracting before settling into her role in the Budina family business of aerial advertising.

In the early days of the business, Mrs. Budina worked on the ground crew and made the banners. As the business grew, she took on the role of president. She retired in 2000.

Mrs. Budina was one of 35 women to start the Women's Air Traffic Controllers Auxiliary in 1962. Under the leadership of Kenneth Lyons of the National Association of Government Employees, the women's auxiliary ran informational pickets at Logan Airport to inform the public about safety concerns in air traffic.

She took the role of den mother in the scouting program and raised two sons to become Eagle Scouts.

Mrs. Budina leaves her husband of 43 years, Joseph C. of Burlington; two sons, Joseph W. of Yucaipa, Calif., and David C. of Fort Lauderdale, Fla.; a daughter, Michelle Travers of Ashby; four sisters, Norma Del Monaco of Roslindale, Beverly Hardy of Danville, N.H., Kathleen DeVanna of Medford, and Linda McFall of Malden; a brother, William Corcoran of Stoneham; and a grandson.
