RESOLVED:

That the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, U.S.A., hereby resolves to request the appropriate officials of Somali to make public the reasons for the arrest of Lt. Col. Abdullahi Jama Galaal, Lt. Col. Abdullahi Jama Samantar, and Lt. Col. Ahmed Mohamed Halla, and to advise whether the rights of these persons are being observed under the United National Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As elected government officials in a democratic society, the Cambridge City Councillors wish to say to Somalian officials that political activity should never result in the violation of a person's liberty, and further that disregard of the personal rights of members of political opposition creates a destabilizing force in the world.

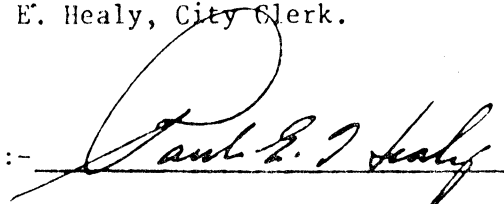
