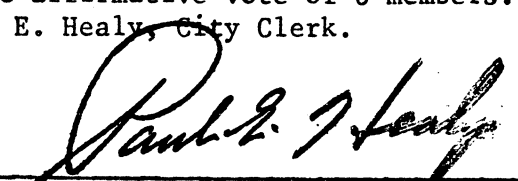
ORDERED:
