- WHEREAS: Last Tuesday morning, December 15, 1987, globules of oil sludge descended from the sky on a substantial part of the eastern Cambridgeport neighborhood, reportedly originating at the Cambridge Smelting Company, of 100 Pacific Street; and
- WHEREAS: This incident caused significant inconvenience for many residents, and could have threatened children at the Graham-Parks School; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager determine the cause of this incident, ascertain whether any clean-up costs should be compensated by the Company, and recommend what steps should be taken to prevent a recurrence; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager report in writing to the City Council as soon as possible.
