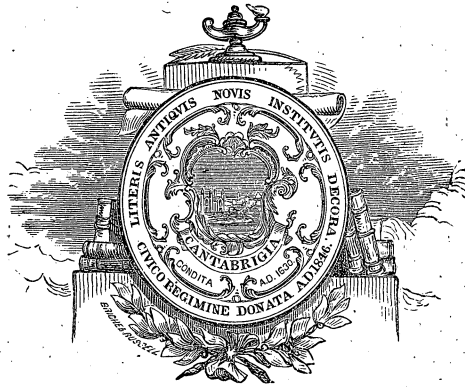


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, Oct. 2. 1867

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that *Warland Street, from Pleasant Street to Magazine Street* should be *laid out as a public way.*

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *the owners in said Warland Street, and all other persons interested,*

that this Board intends to *lay out* the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of *their* land and laying out the same as a public street — and that *Wednesday*, the *23^d* day of *October* current, at *10* o'clock, *P. M.*, is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
