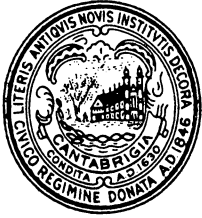
Subject City Council Order No. 5 of Nov. 16, 1981. "Bus Stop on Quincy St."

There has been a bus stop on Quincy Street at Quincy Square since 1967. This bus stop has served the MBTA. There was also a bus stop on Massachusetts Avenue, west of Quincy Street serving the "HR" bus which was moved to Quincy Street at the yellow warning beacon and crosswalk. It was decided to do this for safety reasons as when the warning beacon was installed we had to clear the approach to the crosswalk to allow drivers to see pedestrians.

To accomplish this, one parking meter was removed from Quincy Street and two were installed on Massachusetts Avenue at Quincy Street a distance of 200 feet. This resulted in a net increase of one parking meter in this area.
