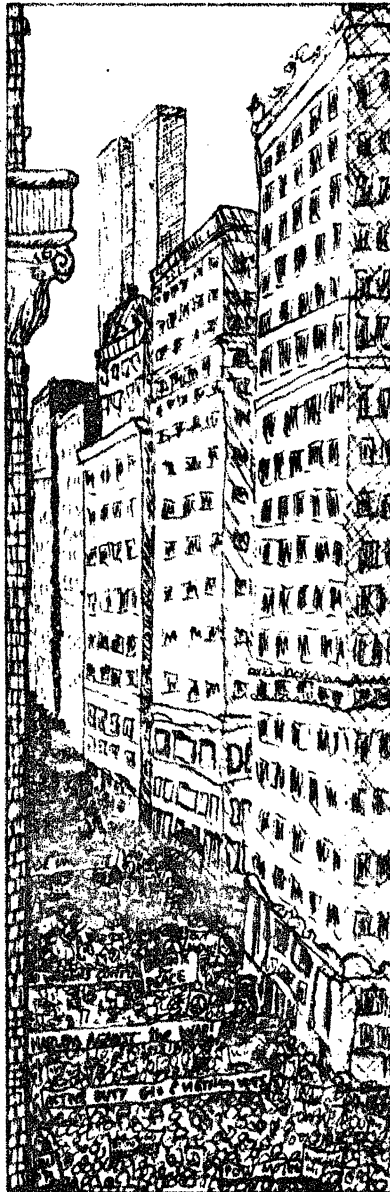

CITY PEACE ACTION DAY PROCLAMATION (Cambridge)

Whereas numerous distinguished citizens and various church, academic and labor organizations throughout sixteen major cities within these United States and acting in concert with similar peaceful assemblages throughout Canada and Europe,

And whereas the citizens of this city and state have evinced a deep desire that there be an end to the war in Vietnam and an end to the killing,

And whereas such strivings for peace coincide with the deep aspiration of the people of our city,

Therefore, be it resolved that November 6 be designed as PEACE ACTION DAY in our city and that where possible, our citizens and their representatives participate in the peace assemblies on that day.
