WHEREAS: One century ago, Cambridge Camping Association was formulated as Cambridge Country Week enabling youngsters a brief respite from the summer heat to spend a fun filled week in the country atmosphere; and

WHEREAS: In 1969, to expand their horizons, the Association founded the Inner City Day Camp Program and currently enroll 540 Cambridge children to enjoy a seven week period of fun and games every summer; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge Camping Association is a well established, well operated entity addressing the needs and community changes of families from Cambridge and Greater Boston; and

WHEREAS: The year 1990 saw the genesis of Daybreak Day Camp, a facility founded to fill the need for a special summer program geared to youngsters with emotional, behavioral, or adjustment problems; and

WHEREAS: In collaboration with 45 agencies and homeless shelter, Cambridge Camping Association is bringing a wealth of happiness to 2000 children ages 5 - 13 from sixty cities and towns;

WHEREAS: To provide total participation in the camping experience, over fifty percent of the children are recruited from families with incomes of \$1000 or less and more than seventy percent from single parent homes; and

WHEREAS: Highlighting the 100th birthday of Cambridge Camping Association is the celebration of Cambridge Camping Association Week, May 17 - May 23, 1993, featuring a parade, exhibits, games and festivities for the entire family; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That I, Kenneth E. Reeves, Mayor of the City of Cambridge and this Cambridge City Council congratulates the Cambridge Camping Association for a century of contributions to the enjoyment and advancement of the youngsters of our city.
