Matignon 9 wins ³ league championship

With a win over Cardinal Spellman last Wednesday, May 16, Matignon High School's baseball team clinched first place in the Catholic Central League with a league record of 7-3. Overall, the team is 10-6 and is headed for the state tournament.

Matignon started the game off well when junior Brian Hardy hit a grand slam home run in the first inning. They never let up, and when the game was called in the sixth inning because of rain, they held a decisive 14-2 margin.

"Our first goal of the season was to win the league championship and our second goal was to be in the state tournament. We achieved our first goal and we're looking forward to doing well in the tournament," said coach John Twombly.

Also last week, several Matignon players were named to the league all-star team: Hardy, a junior; freshman Neil Cafferky; junior George Tsafonias and senior Fran Reed. In addition, Reed was named the league's most valuable player. Freshman Sean Lopolito of Burlington and junior Peter Masters of Lexington were also given honorable mentions in the league all-star voting.

Twombly credited his players for the team's success this season. "We had more wins this season than in the last three seasons combined and this success is the result of the hard work of the players. Although we're inexperienced in tournament play, we're confident we can hold our own," he said.

Matignon plays at Arlington Catholic on Monday, Memorial Day, at 10 am and also must make up a rained-out contest against St. Mary's before heading into the state tournament.
