- WHEREAS: World AIDS Day was first observed in 1988 following an international summit of health ministers determined to raise awareness around the globe to the AIDS epidemic; and
- WHEREAS: The theme of World AIDS Day 2000, "AIDS: All men—make a difference," was chosen to further increase awareness of this disease and encourage all men to take an active role in preventing the spread of HIV/AIDS and to take responsibility for the care of family and other loved ones who have been impacted by AIDS; and
- WHEREAS: Despite the strong efforts of many organizations around the world to educate people on the risk of HIV/AIDS infection, this epidemic continues to spread throughout every region of the world, reaching a record high of 2.8 million reported deaths worldwide in 1999; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge joins the rest of the globe in observing World AIDS Day 2000 on December 1, 2000; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this City Council expresses its gratitude to the American Association for World Health, coordinator for World AIDS Day in the United States, and the many organizations in our country and around the globe who have made a tireless commitment to the eradication of this disease.
