

To the Honorable, the City Council
of the City of Cambridge:

The undersigned respectfully pray that the City of Cambridge make, lay and maintain a new sewer south from Inman Square to Prospect Street for the reason that the sewer now maintained for sewerage purposes is either out of order or otherwise unable to carry the sewerage from the property situated on Cambridge Street.

The undersigned, Simon Fishman, owner of property situated at Cambridge Street and running from 1294 to 1308 Cambridge Street has suffered extensively on account of the sewer connecting his premises on said Cambridge Street as above stated caused great damages by having the impure water and sewerage flow back to his premises through the laboratories and water closets. That happened very many times, and especially did his premises suffer recently to such an extent that the tenants occupying the premises complained of bad odors and nuisance, and on account of the water coming from the sewer, overflowing water closets and remained there for a length of time. Many tenants threatened to move out, and others have moved out on account of said nuisance.

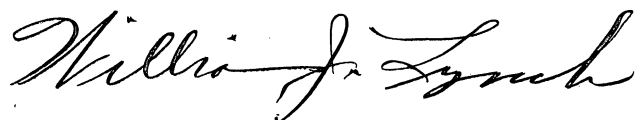
