AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the City
Council of the City of Cam-
bridge as follows:

The General Ordinances of
the City of Cambridge are here-
by amended by striking Chap-
ter 40 and substituting the fol-
lowing new Chapter 40:

CHAPTER 40

COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

1. There shall be a Commu-
nity Schools Commission in the
City of Cambridge.

2. The Commission shall con-
sist of five (5) members, all of
whom shall initially be appoint-
ed by the City Manager with
the proviso that one member
shall be an incumbent mem-
ber of City Council and one of
the members shall be an incum-
bent member of the School
Committee.

3. The initial appointments
shall serve for the following
terms: (a) Two citizen mem-
bers shall be for one year terms
(b) The Council and School
Committee appointments shall
be for two year terms; con-
current with their terms of of-
fice; (c) One citizen member
shall be for a three year term.
After that, all appointments
and/or elections to the Com-
mission shall be for three year
terms with a limit of two con-
secutive terms for each mem-
ber.

4. After the initial appoint-
ment, at least two of the posi-
tions on the Commission shall
be filled by the City Manager
from recommendations from
the Community Schools Advi-
sory Committee after nomina-
tion and election by a majority
of its membership.

5. The members of the Com-
mission shall serve without
compensation.

6. The Commission shall pre-
pare a written plan for im-
plementation of a Community

Schools Program and for the
most advantageous use of the
Schools and any other appro-
priate facilities for the imple-
mentation of such a program.

7. The plan shall be submit-
ted annually for the approval to
the City Council, the School
Committee and the City Mana-
ger.

8. Each elementary school
that functions as a community
school shall have a neighbor-
hood advisory committee repre-
sentative of the area.

9. The City-Wide Advisory
Committee on Community
Schools shall consist of one to
four representatives of each
elementary school in the City
of Cambridge to serve for a
term of four years and in no
event for more than two such
terms. The advisory committee
shall elect from its own mem-
bership a chairman. This chair-
man may at his discretion ap-
point additional city-wide mem-
bers of the Advisory Committee,
providing that such appointees
do not constitute more than
one-third of the total remaining
membership of the committee.

10. Members of the Advisory
Committee may attend all meet-
ings of the Community Schools
Commission, may participate in
all discussions relating to pro-
grams, and may initiate pro-
posals for modifications in ex-
isting programs and activation
of new programs.

11. All decisions shall be made
by a majority vote of the Com-
mission.

12. Once a plan submitted by
the Commission is approved as
set forth in section 7, each city
department concerned with said
plan shall have a duty to car-
ry out its terms.
