WHEREAS: The Boston Herald, in noting this event in its August 13, 1995 edition, profiled Gabriel Paiva, a life-long Cambridge resident, who had been a POW for four years in a Japanese prison camp when World War II ended; and

WHEREAS: Gabriel Paiva, having served in the Navy for seven years when he was taken prison during the fall of Corregidor in 1942, showed courage and determination in the face of torture and deprivation by the Imperial Japanese Government; and

WHEREAS: Gabriel Paiva, and many other Cambridge service men and women, bravely and unselfishly fought and died for their country in both the Pacific and European theaters during World War II; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council, on behalf of the people of Cambridge, offers its sincere appreciation to Gabriel Paiva, and all Cambridge service men and women who bravely and unselfishly served their country in both the Pacific and European theaters during World War II; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be a hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Gabriel Paiva and to each Veterans organization in the City of Cambridge or behalf of the entire City Council.
