- WHEREAS:** It was with great sadness that this City Council learned of the death of Elliot Vining, an executive with the Boy Scouts of America for 30 years; and
- WHEREAS:** Elliot Vining was born and raised in South Weymouth where he graduated from Weymouth High School, setting several track records which have not yet been broken; and
- WHEREAS:** Having served as a Chief Pharmacist Mate in the Navy during World War II, Elliot joined the Old Colony Boy Scout Council in Brockton and later served the Sachem Council, now called the Minuteman Council in Lexington as a field executive; and
- WHEREAS:** Mr. Vining moved to the Cambridge Council in 1954 where he was considered one of the finest camp directors in the nation, serving not only as Executive Director of the Cambridge Council but also Director of Camp Quinapoxet in Rindge, New Hampshire as well as assisting in running a national training center in Shiff Scout Reservation, New Jersey; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending our sincere sympathy to Mr. Vining's sister, Mrs. Martha Parker; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Parker on behalf of this entire City Council.
