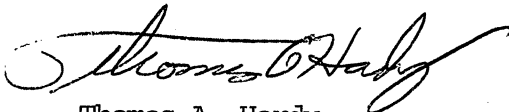

SPEAK OUT!

Comments by David B. Harris

The Cambridge Civic Association calls for the Chief of Police, James Reagan, to suspend any officer against whom there is evidence of wrongdoing in the arrest and detention of Lawrence Largey. We urge prompt completion of the investigation of this matter by the City Manager through his special investigator. We further urge, upon sufficient evidence of wrongdoing, the dismissal of any officer involved, and criminal prosecution where the facts warrant such action. Finally, we insist that effective steps be taken by the Chief of Police, or by the City Manager and City Council if necessary, to root out what seems to be a recurring pattern of unlawful conduct on the part of some policemen. Only such action as we have called for here can restore public confidence in the Cambridge, Police Department.

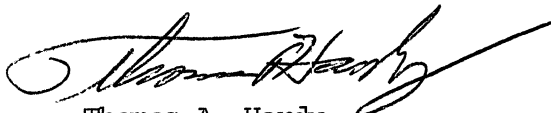
