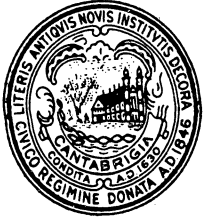

The Department of Public Works street resurfacing program funded by a bond issue in 1979 called for the resurfacing of Cambridge Street from Inman Square to Quincy Street. Inflation forced the department to do less work than anticipated. We had also hoped to ask for additional funds in the 1981-82 budget to continue this program. However Proposition 2½ has forced the department to eliminate all capital spending and reduce much of the operating budget. There are no funds at this time to continue this work but, we are continuing to explore alternative funding sources and Cambridge Street remains a high priority street.

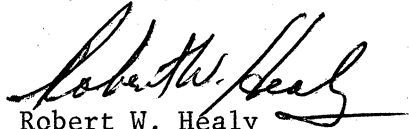
