- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of former National League Umpire and retired Deputy Sheriff Arthur J. Gore; and
- WHEREAS: Arthur umpired in two World Series, the 1951 Yankees-Giants and the Yankees-Dodgers series in 1953, as well as having umpired at two All-Star Games during a career that began with the 1947 season and ended in 1956; and
- WHEREAS: Arthur, after a short stint playing semi-professional baseball, first began calling balls and strikes behind the plate of high school games in the Boston area, as well as coaching basketball at St. Sebastian's School in Newton; and
- WHEREAS: Arthur was a member of the Maine Baseball Hall of Fame, the Boston Gridiron Club and past president of the Eastern Massachusetts Basketball Officials Association; and because of his devotion to baseball, was the 1958 recipient of the Sarasota Club of Boston "Hugh Duffy Memorial Award"; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Millie Gore and to the entire family at this unfortunate loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Gore on behalf of the entire City Council.
