Dear Councillor,

I urge you to maintain Cambridge's lawsuit against the Central Artery's "Son-of-Z" plan, and to instruct the City Manager to NOT SIGN to accept the mitigations.

Son of Z is a very poor deal for Cambridge. The rationale for the Central Artery is aesthetic, with more than \$11 billion to be spent to beautify just one mile in Boston's financial district. But the proposed interchange over the Charles River, Cambridge, and Charlestown is an aesthetic and environmental nightmare. Its maze of spaghetti-like twists and turns will place the Charles in a 330-foot culvert and spew out noise and pollution 24 hours a day, turning parts of Cambridge into an unhealthy battle zone, all done to speed suburban travelers' commutes.

Dear Councillor,

I urge you to maintain the "Son of Z" plan, and to insist on the following conditions:

Son of Z is a very poor idea. The Central Artery is aesthetic, and will cost \$11 billion to be spent to beautify just parts of Cambridge in the battle zone, all done to speed suburban travelers' commutes.

The value of these so-called "mitigations" as currently proposed, is a mere fraction of the highway project itself, and woefully inadequate for city residents who will suffer from increased traffic, noise, and pollution. It is doubtful, moreover, that the city will ever see a penny of the promised funds since the state project already exceeds \$4 billion, a sum which cannot be met with state funds. Courts have already ruled that such conditions of the type about to be signed are unenforceable.

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

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

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

**Re: Central Artery Lawsuit**

Dear City Councilor:

I am writing you as a home owner and as the founder of a business that employs sixteen people, more than half of whom are Cambridge residents. I am writing to urge you to maintain the Central Artery's "Son-of-Z" lawsuit. To those of us who admired from afar Cambridge's successful fight to halt the innerbelt, the prospect of accepting the nominal mitigations for the Central Artery Project is simply unbelievable. That the mitigations include what amounts to an innerbelt through the eastern part of Cambridge is astonishing. In my view your response to these impending disasters should be "they shall not pass!"

Therefore I urge you to maintain Cambridge's lawsuit against the Central Artery's "Son-of-Z" plan. I also urge you to instruct the City Manager not to accept the state's mitigation plan.

To say the most for it, Son-of-Z -- however it is presented -- is a bad deal for Cambridge. The original rationale for the Central Artery was aesthetic: \$11 billion was to be spent to beautify just one mile in Boston's Financial District. However, the proposed interchange over the Charles River connecting Cambridge and Charlestown can only be described as an uglification project.

And, that is to say nothing of the environmental impacts. There is every reason to believe that the artery both in its construction phase and in its operation cannot possibly meet clean air standards.

But leave aside the concerns that affect all of eastern Massachusetts. Just consider the interest of your constituents, the people who elected you. Do we deserve to have the noise, pollution, and desolation that will accompany the artery

and its "mitigations"? Hardly!

As city councilors confronting the real prospect of hitting the Proposition 2 1/2 ceiling, you must be concerned about projects that will erode the tax base in both the residential and commercial sectors. If ever a vote by city council to protect the interest of their narrow constituency would benefit an entire region, your vote against the artery and the "mitigations" will make that difference.

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

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

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
