2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To promote the public health by providing psychiatric and counselling services to persons referred to the Roxbury Court Clinic by the judges of the Municipal Court of the Roxbury District or voluntarily seeking aid from said Clinic in the solution of their behavioral problems, and to cooperate with other organizations seeking to provide community mental health services in the Metropolitan Boston Area. In furtherance of its corporate purposes, the corporation shall have and may exercise all the powers specified in chapter 180, section 6 and chapter 156B, sections 9 and 9A of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as now in force or hereafter amended, except the powers specifically excluded therefrom by chapter 180, section 6 of the General Laws, as now in force or hereafter amended, provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with chapter 180 or any other chapter of the General Laws, as now in force or hereafter amended.

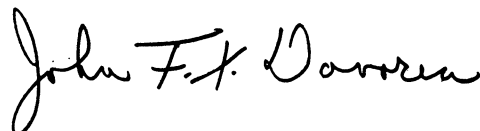

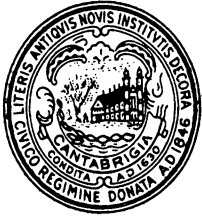

CONTINUATION SHEET 2A

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its corporate purposes herein set forth. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

Upon the dissolution of the corporation pursuant to chapter 180, section 11A of the General Laws (or the corresponding provision of any future Massachusetts law), the assets of the corporation shall be disposed of in accordance with the doctrine of cy pres exclusively for such similar scientific, educational, charitable and benevolent purposes, or to such organization or organizations as are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes, in all respects as a court having jurisdiction in the premises may determine.

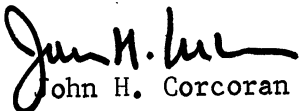
