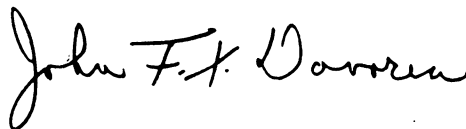

- b) For the purpose of providing training and employment to such vocationally disabled persons, plan, develop, establish, conduct, and operate training sites, work experience placements, and workshops and other enterprises producing goods and services.
- c) Investigate and develop improved programs, systems, and procedures for the employment of such vocationally disabled persons; conduct research, instruction, and investigation regarding the sources of vocational disabilities and problems in training and employing traditionally unemployed or underemployed groups of persons such as alcoholics, criminal offenders, mental patients, juvenile offenders, drug dependent persons, welfare recipients, and the like; promote interest in and the exchange of ideas and information relating to such problems and their causes and to any of the aforesaid matters by gathering and disseminating ideas and information related thereto and by preparing, publishing and distributing reports, publications, educational material, and other written materials of every kind.
- d) Seek and engage the cooperation and support, financial and otherwise, of all manner of public and private agencies and organizations in provision of training, employment, counseling, placement, and such other services as may be necessary to secure temporary or permanent employment of vocationally disabled persons.

Transitional Employment Enterprises, Inc.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

The corporation is organized exclusively for educational, charitable and scientific purposes, as those terms are defined in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, and in furtherance of those purposes shall:

- a) Provide and secure education, institutional training, work experience, on-the-job training, apprenticeship training, and employment to persons who, due to lack of skills, training, experience, opportunity, or to social, physical, mental, or emotional handicap, or to discrimination, suffer vocational disabilities which hinder them in, or prevent them from, securing and retaining stable employment and advancement in the conventional job market; provide recruitment, screening, selection, and job placement of and for such persons; provide orientation, counseling, and such other supportive services and supervision as are necessary to develop suitable work habits and secure proper training and employment of such persons.

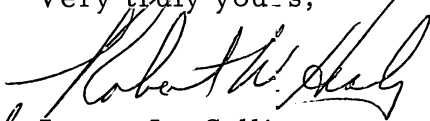
