Thank you for writing to me regarding the establishment of a housing trust fund for Boston hotel workers. I greatly appreciate knowing of your support for this important measure.

You may be interested to know that in September 1989 I met with members of Local 26 and pledged my support and interest in working with Senator Kennedy to secure passage of a housing trust fund bill during the 101st Congress. It is my understanding that during the next several months the House Education and Labor Subcommittee on Labor-Management Relations expects to take up legislation identical to S. 1949 that would amend the Taft-Hartly Act to provide financial assistance for employee housing.

You may be assured of my continued strong support for the establishment of a housing trust fund that would assist Local 26 employees and others in securing affordable housing. To this end, on January 5 I wrote to Rep. William Clay, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Labor-Management Relations, urging prompt and favorable consideration of a House companion bill to S. 1949. The Massachusetts delegation also sent a letter on February 7 to Rep. Clay reaffirming our strong commitment to the establishment of a housing trust fund.

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Dear Mr. Flynn:

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You may be interested to know that in September 1989 I met with members of Local 26 and pledged my support and interest in working with Senator Kennedy to secure passage of a housing trust fund bill during the 101st Congress. On January 5 I wrote to Rep. William Clay, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Labor-Management Relations, urging prompt and favorable consideration of a House companion bill to S. 1949. The Massachusetts delegation also sent a letter on February 7 to Rep. Clay reaffirming our strong commitment to the establishment of a housing trust fund.

On February 22 I joined Rep. Clay as an original cosponsor of H.R. 4073, legislation identical to S. 1949 that would amend the Taft-Hartly Act to provide financial assistance for employee housing. On March 28, the House Education and Labor Committee favorably reported out H.R. 4073 and hopes to have the bill on the Floor in early April. As H.R. 4073 moves through the legislative process, you may be assured my continued strong support for the establishment of a housing trust fund that would assist Local 26 employees and others in securing affordable housing.
