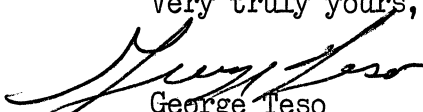

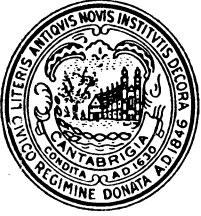

PRESS RELEASE

On May 25 and 26, 1976, Traffic will be detoured to one side of Massachusetts Avenue at Cameron Avenue to allow for the upgrading of the Railroad Crossing by the Boston and Maine Railroad. The upgrading will consist of laying of a new railroad bed and the installation of a new rubberized roadway and new track.

The detour will be in effect between the hours of 9:00 AM and 3:30 PM and we are requesting that drivers avoid using Massachusetts Avenue during those days.

This crossing is the first of several that will be upgraded this year. The City of Cambridge is doing everything it can to make the Sherman Street Railroad crossing the next project to be done.

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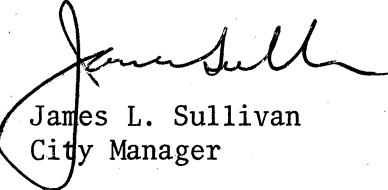
