In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 7th 1864

The Joint Committee on Roads and Bridges, in compliance with an order of Nov. 30th that they take into consideration the expediency of adopting some general plan, in regard to Street Crossings have considered the same and respectfully report —

The subject of Street Crossings is a very important one. There are hundreds of places, where it would be a great convenience to have them laid. The cost, at the present time, is about one dollar and sixty five cents (\$1.65) per running foot, the material costing seventy five cents (\$.75) per foot and the labor, the balance. At some future time, when Peace shall have been restored and the price of labor and material have been reduced, your Committee believe it will be the true policy of the City to assume the entire expense of placing crossings in all the principal places in the City. The Committee recommend that for the present, in all ordinary cases, the City perform the labor, the Petitioners finding the material.
