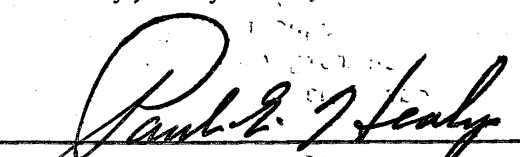

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Maxwell Swartz, a career Cambridge Schoolteacher, will retire from his profession, completing thirty-three years of service, effective October 24, 1984; and
- WHEREAS: Max has a long association with Cambridge and the school system, having graduated from the Longfellow Elementary School in 1933 and Cambridge High and Latin School in 1937 and he later graduated from the Museum School of Fine Arts in 1948, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree and, four years later, in 1952, received a Master of Education degree; and
- WHEREAS: Max also studied art in Paris at the Sorbonne and Beaux Art Ecole, as well as in Florence, Italy and he has had prints of his work hung at the Brookline Art Museum, and is a Past President of the Rocky Neck Art Association; and
- WHEREAS: Max, has almost from the day he was appointed to the School Department in 1951 instilled a new sense of understanding to his students in terms of realizing what art is and how one creates it; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere appreciation to Maxwell Swartz for his total dedication to the students of the Cambridge School System, and to further extend its every good wish for much good health and happiness as he retires from the Peabody School and enters a new phase of his life; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Swartz on behalf of the entire City Council.
