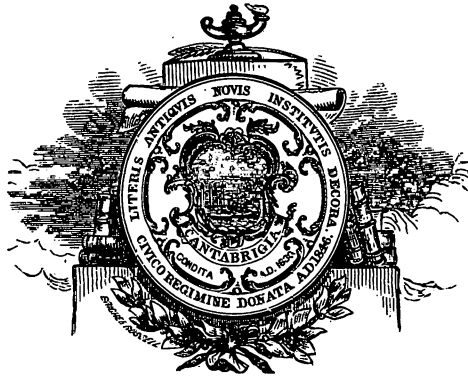

In Board of Aldermen,

Dec. 28, 1874,

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

*a widening should be made
at the junction of
Hampshire and Cambridge Streets,*

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land ~~or~~

*at the junction of
Hampshire and Cambridge Streets*

*present lines and the line of the present building at
said junction as*
as is included between the ~~line~~ shown on a plan ~~at~~ -----

~~Street~~, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *Dec. 15, 1874* and now before this

Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Hampshire and
Cambridge Streets*

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said *widening* be estimated
and awarded as follows:

To Crimp & Calf 38 sq. ft. of Land @ \$1.50 = \$57.00

Ordered, That *three months*, be allowed to the persons whose land is
taken for said *widening* for the removal of *all obstructions* standing
on the land so taken as aforesaid.
