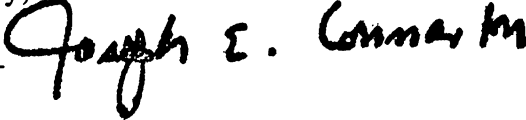
RESOLVED: That this City Council proclaims April 26, 1991 Arbor Day in Cambridge and urges all citizens to participate in the local celebrations.
