- WHEREAS: This City Council was saddened upon learning of the death of Raymond McLay, former long time Cambridge businessman and late owner of Treeland located on Memorial Drive; and
- WHEREAS: Raymond, born and educated in Andover, was a graduate of the Massachusetts Agricultural School in Amherst, founding Treeland in 1938 where he worked diligently to make it the thriving business he retired from in 1976; and
- WHEREAS: Raymond was extremely interested in the quality of life in Cambridge and during the landscaping of Memorial Drive, donating the cherry trees along the drive and as further evidence of his civic interest, he served as a charter member of the Cambridge Redevelopment Authority, serving on that board from the late 1950's until 1960; and
- WHEREAS: Although Raymond was an extremely busy businessman, he still found time to serve as a member of the Cambridge Chamber of Commerce, the Harvard Club of Boston and the Hatherly Country Club in Scituate; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire McLay family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the McLay family on behalf of the entire City Council.
