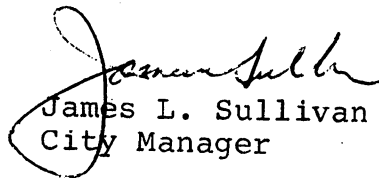
Dear Ms. Shapiro:

I am writing to you at the request of the Cambridge City Council regarding your bus shelter installation program. It has become apparent that there is a need to replace the deteriorated shelter at the Cambridge Infirmary. This bus stop is heavily used by the Infirmary's staff, visitors and workers from the industrial area on the other side of Concord Avenue. The present shelter has been seriously damaged by vandals and provides little or no protection from the weather.

The bus stop is located on Concord Avenue opposite Moulton Street. I would like this location placed as a high priority on your list of shelters to be installed in Cambridge.

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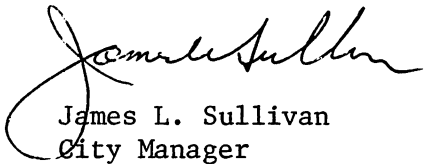
