WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge Fair Housing Committee is awarding its sixth "Innovations in Fair Housing Award" to Cambridge Council of Realtors, in recognition of their efforts in promoting affordable housing in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge Fair Housing Committee is awarding its third "Margot P. Kosberg Award" to Zelia Pacheco-Kelleher, Fair Housing Committee member for her commitment in promoting Fair Housing in Cambridge; and

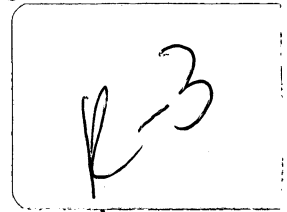
