He received his A.B. from Dartmouth College in 1942, his A.M. from Teachers College, Columbia University in 1947, and his Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from Boston University in 1956. From 1944 until his retirement in 1975, Dr. Peebles served on the staff of the Child Psychiatry Service at Massachusetts General Hospital, being Chief Psychologist from 1957 onward. He also held the position of Assistant Clinical Professor of Psychology, Department of Psychiatry, Harvard Medical School. Dr. Peebles was appointed by Governor Francis Sargent to the original Massachusetts Board of Registration of Psychologists in 1972, serving as Secretary from 1972-1975 and Chairman from 1975-1978. In 1982, Dr. Peebles was given the Ezra Saul Psychologist Service Award by the Massachusetts Psychological Association. Dr. Peebles was known by friends and colleagues for his dedication, kindness and wit. Dr. Peebles served in the U. S. Army during W.W. II, being awarded the Bronze Star Medal.
