RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Norman J. Aubert, Sr.** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

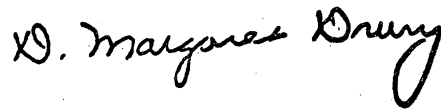

Norman J. Aubert Jr., Cambridge police officer

Norman J. "Normie" Aubert Sr. of Watertown, a retired Cambridge police officer, died Tuesday at Palliative Care Center of the Deaconess Beth Israel Medical Center of cancer. He was 70.

Born in Cambridge, he was raised in Cambridgeport. Mr. Aubert graduated from Cambridge Bridge and Latin High School. He graduated with an associate's degree from Northeastern University in 1978 and a bachelor's degree from the university in 1980. He earned a master's degree from Anna Maria College in 1981.

He served in the Navy during World War II.

Mr. Aubert joined the Cambridge Auxiliary Police Department in 1959 and was appointed to the Cambridge uniform force in 1961. He was a foot patrolman for the traffic division in Harvard Square.

During the 1970s, he was squad leader of the Tactical Squad, and frequently taught at the Cambridge Police Academy during the 1980s. He retired in 1992.

In March 1992, Mr. Aubert received the Cambridge Police Department's most courteous officer award for his dedication to public safety and the community.

After his retirement from the Cambridge force, Mr. Aubert was a library security officer at Harvard University. He formerly worked for Raytheon's metallurgical laboratory in Waltham.

He was an usher at St. Patrick's Parish and a member of the Piave Fiume Lodge 1036, OSIA in Watertown, and was a life member of the Massachusetts Police Association.

He is survived by his wife, Eva D. (Migliaccio); a son, Norman of Chelmsford; a sister, Rita Burke; a brother, Harold; and two grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 9 a.m. tomorrow at Church of St. Patrick, Watertown.
