A communication has been received from His Honor the Mayor notifying the City Council of the death of Martin A. Feeley, a former member of the City Council and member of the Water Board, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of this sad event.

Martin A. Feeley was a resident of Cambridge for over fifty years, a well known and highly respected business man, always interested in the municipal activities of the city and served diligently and unselfishly for the cause of good government. In his business career he served for years as president of the Master Painters' Association. He was a member of the Elks and the Knights of Columbus. During the years 1919 and 1920 he represented old Ward 7 in the City Council and, from 1925 until his death, he was a member of the Water Board serving as president during the past two years.
