WHEREAS:-

This City Council learned with deep regret of the passing of Dwight David Eisenhower at the age of seventy-eight years, and

WHEREAS:-

Like Americans everywhere we are grievously affected by the death of Dwight David Eisenhower, a magnificently human man whose will to live seemed as invincible as his smile, and

WHEREAS:-

Every honor which a man could expect to attain had been achieved by Dwight David Eisenhower - named Commanding General of the European Theatre of Operations in 1942, Chief of Staff of the Army from 1945 to 1948, President of Columbia University from 1948 to 1950, Supreme Commander of Nato from 1950 to 1952 and President of the United States from 1952 to 1960, and

WHEREAS:-

His personal life was one of achievement as a statesman soldier, a man who achieved the status of an authentic hero in a turbulent world and was regarded as one of the truly great men in American history, therefore be it

RESOLVED:-

That this City Council in session assembled express its deep sorrow at the passing of Dwight David Eisenhower, and be it further

RESOLVED:-

That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the records of this City Council and a copy sent to Mrs. Dwight D. Eisenhower.
