Gentlemen

It having come to the knowledge of the Water Board that the material in the old city gravel pit on the border of Fresh Pond, is no longer suitable for use on the streets, and the gravel pit is now left in a rough and unsightly condition,

The Water Board would respectfully suggest, if there is no objection on the part of the "Committee on Roads and Bridges", whether the interests of the City would not now be best served by passing an order, turning over the same to the Water Board, that it may use the material left there, in grading up the lot of land, and elsewhere around the border of the Pond where it is needed, and thus greatly improve the looks of the place.
