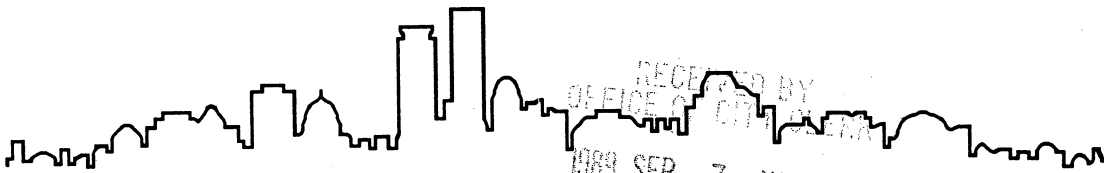

Does your organization have a vacant lot that needs cleaning up, a building that needs painting, or a garden that needs to be cleared? Or perhaps you could use some help sorting food for a salvage program or renovating a homeless shelter? Would you like a team of volunteers to visit with homebound people or throw a party for children in need?

On Saturday, November 4, City Year and the Massachusetts AFL-CIO/Frontlash are ready to lend you a hand. That day, about 500 volunteers will unite to perform a variety of community service projects. We hope that a team of these **City Year for a Day** volunteers can serve you.

City Year is a unique community service initiative. In the spirit of an urban Peace Corps, City Year is uniting 17- to 22-year-olds from diverse backgrounds in a full-time community service corps. On November 4, the City Year corps members and skilled laborers from the Massachusetts AFL-CIO/Frontlash will be joined by 500 volunteers of all ages from the Greater Boston area to perform a day of high-impact community service projects. In addition to providing more than 3000 hours of community service and completing roughly 40 service projects throughout Boston, these City Year for a Day volunteers will raise \$25,000 from individual and corporate sponsors to help fund City Year's corps members.
