- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of the Reverend John J. Sheehan, retired pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church in Everett; and
- WHEREAS: Father Sheehan, a Cambridge native, graduated from Boston College in 1925, Saint Anselm's College in 1929 and upon completion of his studies at Saint John's Seminary, was ordained a priest in 1933 at the Holy Cross Cathedral and was assigned as a parish priest at the Sacred Heart Church in Malden, where, because of his desire to involve the youth of the parish in spiritual and recreational development, he founded the Sacred Heart Crusaders, a drum-and-bugle team that became widely acclaimed in the 1950's throughout New England; and
- WHEREAS: Father Sheehan, prior to being named pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church in Everett, served parishes in Amesbury, Haverhill and Danvers, and also served as a Navy Chaplain during World War II and served as national chaplain for the Veteran's of Foreign Wars; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the Reverend John J. Sheehan's two sisters, Margaret M. Quinn of Arlington and Catherine Sheehan of Cambridge, at this unfortunate time; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
