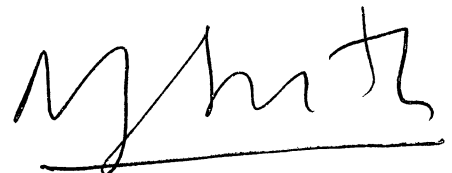
We are currently in the process of drafting language for this ordinance. When it is completed, probably some time in August, we will submit copies to all members of the Council.
