- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to each of the winners on behalf of the entire City Council.

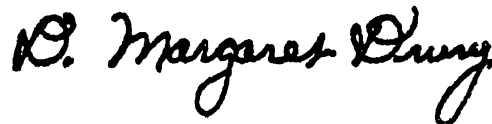

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has a Climate Protection Plan that establishes a goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions in Cambridge by 20% below 1990 levels by 2010; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge is encouraging the implementation of energy efficiency measures as a means of reducing green house gas emissions and improving the environment and quality of life by reducing our reliance on fossil fuels and foreign sources of oil; and

WHEREAS: The business and institutional community plays an important role in using energy and has many opportunities to become more efficient; and

WHEREAS: It is important to recognize these energy efficiency measures, which have a significant positive impact on Cambridge residents and the employees of these communities; and

WHEREAS: Hines is a company located in Cambridge and has fewer than 50 employees in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Hines is implementing an active energy conservation program that has saved over 2.5 million kilowatt-hours of electricity and reduced greenhouse gas emissions by over 1,800 tons of CO2 annually; and

WHEREAS: Genzyme Corporation is a company located in Cambridge and has over 50 employees in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Genzyme Corporation has constructed the Genzyme Center building, which is expected to receive a LEED Platinum rating from the U.S. Green Building Council and use 40% less energy than a similar conventional building; and
