

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty seven.

An Ordinance,

in addition to an "Ordinance, prescribing the duties of the Weighers of Hay and other articles".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. The fees for weighing, at the City Scales, shall be as follows, to wit:— one cent and one-half for every hundred pounds of hay or straw; at the rate of eight cents for every two thousand pounds of barilla, anthracite or other coal, iron, ice, stones, and lumber; and one cent for every hundred pounds of any other article; provided, however, that the fees for weighing any article other than those above specified, shall never be less than ten cents, nor more than fifty cents; and the tare shall in all cases be weighed without charge.

2. The sixth section of an "Ordinance, prescribing the duties of weighers of hay and other articles", passed July 14, 1846, is hereby repealed.
