In reviewing the work of the past year, the Committee find that Twenty Nine Thousand, Six Hundred and Seventy Nine feet of edgestone have been set and Thirty Three Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Nine yards of paving has been completed. In addition to the above there has already been ordered Eleven Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty Eight feet of edgestones and Ten Thousand yards of Paving making an aggregate almost equal to the ordinary work of three years, nor do your Committee consider that this amount, large as it seems is any more than will be required for years to come until our city shall be not only the second in the Commonwealth in respect to population
