

The undersigned, residents ^{on} or owners of real estate on Follen St., which has been laid out and maintained at the sole expense of the abutters for more than a quarter of a century, respectfully petition the City Council that said street may be accepted by the City, and made into a public highway. As the street consists of two portions meeting at a sharp angle, they further ask that the broader portion, from the Arsenal corner to Mrs. Mann's house may be named Felton St., and the narrower portion, from Mrs. Mann's house to Waterhouse St., may be named Follen St.
