The Committee on Roads and Bridges of this Board, to which was referred the Petition of the Water Board that the grades of Inman, Pleasant and Wolcott Streets may be established, so that the water mains may be laid below the reach of frost:—
would respectfully

Report: That there is no established grade for said Streets, and in the absence of a comprehensive Survey of the City it is not in the power of the Board to establish the proper grade.

The Committee would therefore recommend that the matter be referred to the City Engineer, with instructions to give to the Water Board the best approximate grade which, without such a survey, he can determine upon.
