- WHEREAS: Serious questions have arisen concerning the City's right to approve additional parking under the Cambridge Parking Freeze imposed by the EPA; and
- WHEREAS: Apparently the City did not, until September 20, 1988, fulfill its obligation to submit a parking inventory and annual report required prior to implementation of its authority granted by Governor Dukakis in 1984 to administer the Cambridge Parking Freeze; and
- WHEREAS: It is not clear whether the City is allowed under EPA regulations to grant permission for additional parking except for residential and on-street parking; and
- WHEREAS: These questions will arise should the City Council grant a hearing to citizens concerned about the development of the Binney Street garage; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager prepare for the City Council a memorandum outlining the City's responsibility and authority with regard to the granting of permission for parking and the Cambridge Parking freeze; and be it further
- ORDERED: That he submit with this memorandum the documents relevant to this issue; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this material submitted prior to the hearing on Binney Street.

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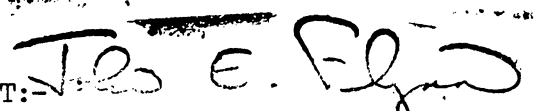
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- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to keep the City Council updated on an ongoing basis of any and all developments in this issue.

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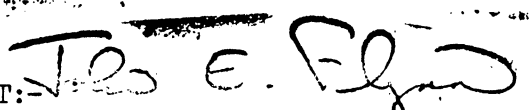
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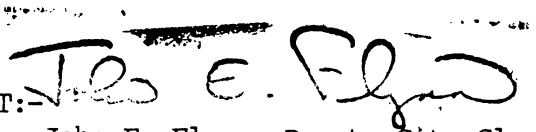
