In Board of Aldermen, Oct. 26. 1874.

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

Magazine Street
be widened on its Eastern side

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *the Eastern side of*
Magazine Street

as is included between the lines shown on a plan of *Magazine*
as given in the office of
Street, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *and now before this*
~~Board~~, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Magazine*
Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said *wrecking* be estimated
and awarded as follows:

Joseph A. Holmes 140 sq. ft. of land @ \$11.25 - \$1575.00
Damage to building 250.00 \$1825.00

Eliza Ann Cleary 85 sq. ft. of land .50 42.50
Damage to building, &c. 457.50 500.00
\$925.00

Ordered, That twenty days, be allowed to the persons whose land is
taken for said widening for the removal of buildings, &c. standing
on the land so taken as aforesaid.
