To the Honorable, the Mayor and Aldermen,
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully ~~prays~~ represents that he is the owner of one half of the "Warren & Smith Wharf", so called, and holds the other half of same Wharf, as Trustee. This Wharf measures 150 feet on Bridge Street and is bounded on the West by the Wharf of Wellington Brothers. He also holds, as Trustee, the "Warren Wharf", so called, lying Easterly of the first mentioned wharf, which measures 156 feet on Bridge Street. From this "Warren Wharf" the City took for the widening of Bridge Street a strip 156 feet in length by $25\frac{3}{4}$ feet in depth, containing 4017 square feet. For this land so taken he prays that an additional award at the rate of 20 cents per foot may be made to him, believing that the land is worth more than the adjacent land to that amount, and the same being so valued in the books of the Assessors.
