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Pulitzer Prize writer to speak at Harvard

Anthony Lewis, the Pulitzer Prize-winning New York Times columnist and former Supreme Court reporter, will be Harvard Law School's 1997 Class Day speaker. He will deliver his address during Class Day ceremonies on Wednesday, June 4, 2:30 pm on Holmes Field, in front of Langdell Hall, 1545 Mass. Ave.

Lewis' ties to Harvard Law School date back to 1956-57, when he was a Nieman Fellow at the school. He returned to the law school in 1974 as a lecturer, a position he held for 15 years.

He is the author of several books, including "Gideon's Trumpet," "Portrait of a Decade: The Second American Revolution" and "Make No Law: the Sullivan Case and the First Amendment," as well as several law review articles.

He received the Pulitzer Prize in 1955 and 1963. He also is the recipient of the Heywood Brown Award and the Overseas Press Club Award.

Lewis has spent most of his 49-year journalism career with the New York Times, where he has served as

Supreme Court reporter and chief London correspondent. He has been an editorial columnist since 1969.

He received a bachelor of arts degree from Harvard College and has received honorary degrees from Adelphi University, Rutgers University, New York Medical College, Williams College, Clark University, Syracuse University, Colby College and Northeastern University.

Nobel Peace Prize winner Felipe Belo, the bishop of Timor, will speak on Sunday, June 1, at St. Paul Church in 1 Square at the invitation of young people of St. Paul. Belo's talk is set for 2:45 pm (open at 2:15 pm).

At the 1996 Nobel ceremony in Oslo last October, Belo called himself "the voice of the voiceless people of East Timor" and the tradition of Martin Luther King Jr., whom he greatly admires. He is training his 90 percent Catholic country to resist the genocidal levels of abuse by Indonesian invaders with a but peaceful protest.
