- WHEREAS: John F. Cremens was first nominated to the rank of Brigadier General on June 2, 1977 by Major General Vahan Vartanian, Adjutant General of the Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS: Among the many honors and positions General Cremens held is that of a past Commanding Officer of the Governor's Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company, one of our most distinguished Colonial Units; now therefore be it
