

# City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Six.

An Ordinance  
in addition to "an Ordinance, in relation  
to Burial Grounds and the Interment  
of the Dead."

Be it ordained by the City Council  
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sec. 1. Where the Undertaker is requested  
to furnish, and furnishes, other than  
a Funeral Car or Hearse provided by the  
City, he shall be entitled to receive as  
compensation therefor in addition to fees  
now allowed by ordinance, a sum not  
exceeding five dollars, where one horse,  
and not exceeding six dollars where two  
horses, are used with the same.

Sec. 2. Where the Undertaker is required  
to carry a body outside the limits of the City,  
he shall be entitled to receive as compen-  
sation therefor, a sum not exceeding one  
dollar for one mile or fraction of a mile,

And fifty cents for every additional mile beyond said limits, which shall be in addition to fees otherwise provided for.

Sec. 3. Section Eighth of the Ordinance "in relation to Burial Grounds and the Interment of the Dead" is hereby amended, by striking out the word "used" in the fifth line, and substituting therefor the following words: "at the disposal of the undertakers" - so that the sentence shall read "which <sup>cars</sup> ~~cases~~ or hearses shall be at the disposal of the undertakers for all interments made in any of the burial grounds belonging to the City"
